

MIDCOAST MAINE LIGHTHOUSE CHALLENGE

June 25th & 26th, 2016

Lighthouse Challenge Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: How do I register for the Challenge?

A: You may register for the Challenge at any of the seven main lighthouses (Pemaquid Point, Marshall Point, Owls Head, Rockland Breakwater, Grindle Point, Fort Point and Dyce Head). Additionally, there will be a limited amount of registration forms at each bonus Challenge location.

Q: Is there any cost for participating in the Challenge?

A: There is no charge for the Challenge itself. However, some locations do have admission charges, parking fees or suggested donations to visit and/or climb the towers. There is also a charge for the ferry to Grindle Point on the island of Islesboro.

Q: Is there a suggested route to take in order to complete the Challenge?

A: Start from the southern or northern most location on Saturday and work your way towards the middle (Rockland). The Rockland area contains two lighthouses and three bonus sites, so it makes sense to end your day and begin the next one there. Finish what's left in the Rockland area on Sunday morning, then travel the opposite direction from Saturday. Which "end" you start with on Saturday will no doubt be determined by which direction you need to head for home after you complete the Challenge on Sunday. Try to start out both days so that you arrive at your first location at 9:00 a.m. or shortly thereafter.

Q: Are there maps and/or directions available in advance of the event so that I can familiarize myself with the area?

Q: Who is eligible to win prize for completing the Challenge?

A: You need to be over 17 years of age and visit all seven lighthouses (Pemaquid Point, Marshall Point, Owls Head, Rockland Breakwater, Grindle Point, Fort Point and Dyce Head) over the weekend. Proof of visitation is either having the seven mementoes representing each respective lighthouse or stamps of the same in the commemorative booklet.
